 - Posted February 1st April 30th
- OSHA 301 Injury and Illness Report

RECORDKEEPING

COMMON QUESTIONS

- Multiple Business Establishments 1904.30(a)
 - Must keep a separate OSHA 300 Log for each establishment that is expected to be in operation for one year or longer.
- Covered Employees 1904.31(a)
 - Labor, executive, hourly, salary, part-time, season, or migrant workers
 - Employees not on payroll that you supervise
- Change in Ownership 1904.34
 - Record and report for the period that you owned the establishment
 - When sold, transfer to the new owner
- Record Retention 1904.33(a)
 - Keep for five years



ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL

MARCH 2 DEADLINE


- Establishments from 20-249 employees in certain high-hazard industries.
- Establishments more than 250 employees submit.
- Proposed March 30, 2022
 - Establishments with 100 or more employees in new appendix of high hazard industries must submit their 300, 300a and 301.





SEVERE INJURY REPORTING

- Fatalities
 - 8 Hours
- In-Patient Hospitalization, Amputation, or Loss of an Eye
 - 24 hours
- Report online or by phone at OSHA.GOV
- Report to state that the incident occurred in
- Motor vehicle incidents not included.


